


Francisco Verá Manzanares

ENVIROMENTAL ACTIVIST AND SOCIAL LEADER 1982



Francia Márquez is a Colombian social, cultural and environmental leader. She has worked in defence of the rivers at the town of Suarez (Cauca) and the ancestral territories of the Afrocolombian communities, striving to stop mining activities (both legal and illegal) in their territory. Winner of The Goldman Environmental Prize in 2018 – also

known as the Environmental Nobel Prize.

ABOUT HER CHALLENGES

In 2014, together with other 18 women, she started to march towards the Colombian capital, that would be later named as "The March of Turbans". In IO days they walked 350 kilometers.

In 2015 she was invited to mediate in the peace process between rebels and Colombian government which was taking place in La Havana. She was well known by then and had won the Colombia National Prize.

"Europe's privileges rely on the plunder of other countries," said Marquéz "We ask you to put your development into the service of the life of our communities. They are killing us, it is a genocide". She stated when she was awarded in 2018.
